KEYNOTE SPEAKER Dr. Lynn Jones

Dr. Lynn Jones is an accomplished community historian, human rights and labour activist, and founder of Truro's DownTheMarsh Community Land Trust.

Throughout her life, Dr. Jones has been active in the pursuit of justice, working tirelessly to eradicate racism, obtain reparations, secure human rights, and achieve fair labour practices. Dr. Jones was the first African Canadian elected to the executive ranks of the Canadian Labour Congress and serves as chair of the Nova Scotian chapter of the Global Afrikan Congress. The Lynn Jones African Canadian & Diaspora Heritage Collection, which she donated to St Mary's University, holds over 15,000 items documenting over 50 years of African Canadian history. She is the recipient of the Order of Canada and honorary doctorates from Acadia University in Wolfville as well as Mount St. Vincent University in Halifax.

Founded by Dr. Jones, DowntheMarsh CLT is a rural organization aiming to create affordable housing in Truro, Nova Scotia for Black residents affected by gentrification. In her keynote address, Lynn will share motivations and aspirations for DowntheMarsh CLT.


African Nova Scotians: Past, Present, and Future

Acquisition Crash Course

Sunday, September 14, 10 AM - 3 PM Downtown Halifax, Venue TBA, Lunch provided

This full-day workshop will take CLT practitioners through an intensive, hands-on training covering the key steps involved in preserving affordable rental housing through acquisitions. This step-by-step crash course addresses every stage in an acquisition, from assessing community needs and selecting a site to post-acquisition stewardship. Bring your computer!

A major focus of the workshop is the acquisition pro forma, which participants will get to work with to understand key drivers of financial feasibility. With a focus on CLTs, the workshop will also include topics like working with operating partners, communicating with new tenants, and including your community board and membership in decision-making.

Please note this session is intended to build capacity for those involved with community land trusts as a member, staff, board member, or another significant capacity. Spots are very limited.
